

The Cozzo farm is located on the gentle hills of Dogliani, in the Langhe, which has always been a land of great wines.

Historical documents testify that as early as 1827 in the company lands the vine was cultivated and wine was produced, a tradition that has been handed down from father to son until the second half of the seventies when it was inherited by Mario Cozzo.

The historical headquarters of the company is Cascina Lasagna, an ancient farmhouse of the second half of the 1700s, which was also the residence of the King's secretary and which hosted General Napoleon Bonaparte, who had passed there to collect the "keys of the country" (... ... The symbol of the company is born from this historical fact, a key wedged in letter C).

At the end of the 1990s, his son Daniele arrived first to assist Mario Cozzo in the running of the company, followed by his nephew Gian Luca and the company annexed the nearby Cascina Braida, where the



refinement phases are concentrated and wine storage and which has joined the production rooms of Cascina Lasagna.

To date, the winery is spread over an area of about 15 hectares of vineyards and the most cultivated grape variety is Dolcetto.

Among the wines produced, the two crus stand out: Dogliani Docg "Dusin" and Dogliani Docg

"Pregliasco" (no more than 3,000 bottles a year obtained from one of the few remaining vineyards on a free foot), the Langhe Freisa Doc and the Langhe Doc " Countach ", a small selection (1,000 bottles and 1,500 magnums and only in the best years) obtained from Syrah grapes, aged 18 months in large oak barrels and at least 6 months in bottle before being put on sale





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
